

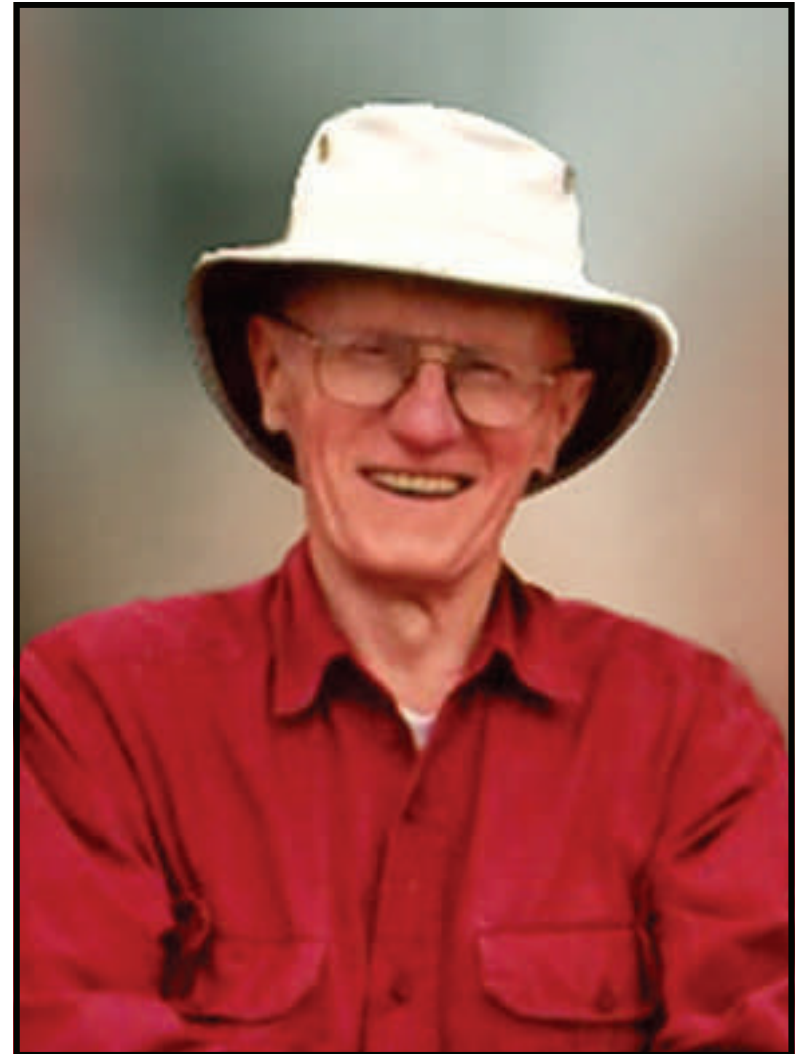
*Grieve not for me, though I am gone,
