

God's Garden

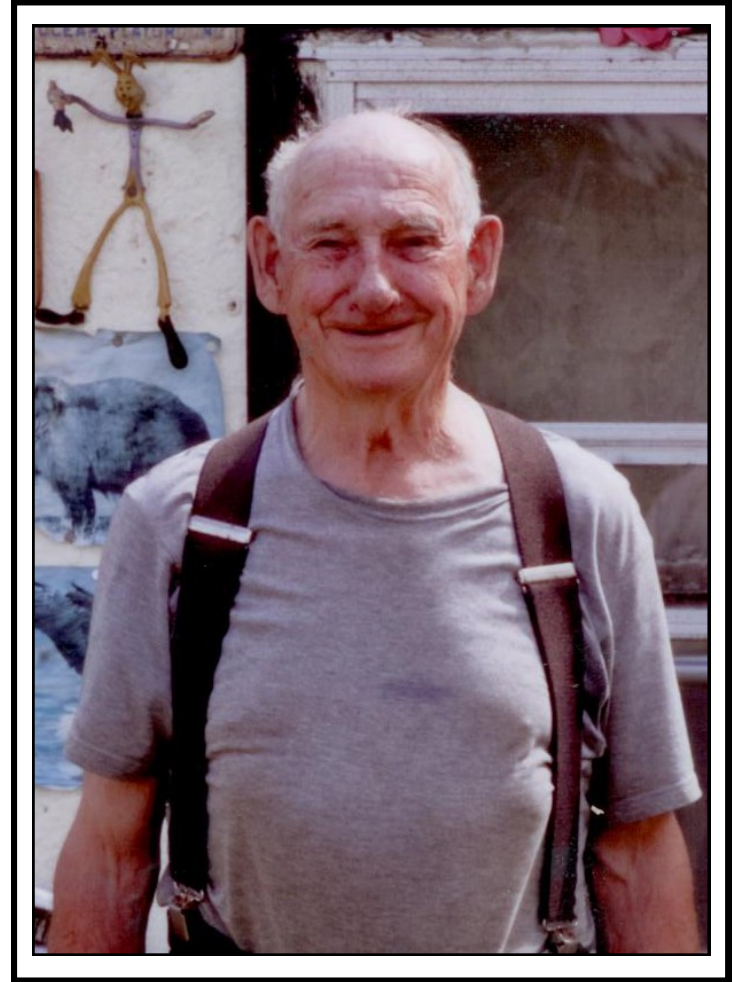
*God looked around his garden
